Physical indicators

(if present, proceed to step one):

- Unexplained abdominal pain
- Signs of physical trauma
- Unusual infections such as TB or immunizable diseases
- Sexually transmitted infections
- Several somatic symptoms arising from stress
- Malnutrition, dehydration
- Pregnancies or abortions
- Unusual injuries

Red flags

(if present, proceed to step one):

- History of running away from home
- Frequently absent from school
- Inconsistent or scripted historyDiscrepancy between the history
- Discrepancy between the history and clinical presentation
- Unable to give address
- Doesn't know current city
- Late presentation
- Exhibits inappropriate sexual behavior

Control indicators (if present, proceed

to step one):

- Accompanied by a controlling person
- Controlling person doesn't allow patient to answer
- Person interrupts or corrects the patient
- Patient exhibits fear, nervousness and/or avoids eye contact
- Patient exhibits hypervigilance, or subordinate demeanor
